





In an interview last year, famed astrophysicist Neil DeGrasse Tyson was asked what questions he would hope to have answered at the end of his life. He said that it wasn't the answers he would be looking for, but rather, what will be the questions people will be asking at that time. For the past ten years Interplay Coaching has observed that there is one skill-set that consistently hampers even the best executives and managers; the ability to ask good questions. Knowing when to pivot to ask good questions helps to build the skill-sets of both employees and of leaders themselves. Asking questions builds conversational confidence when
